Getting to Know You

1. Have you ever been in a situation where disaster was imminent, and you needed saving? Explain.

Digging Deeper

1. The Jews of the first century read their Scriptures as saying that their generation was the one for which prophecy would come true. They were eager for signs that Israel had at last arrived at their destination and God was bringing about the fulfillment of his promises. Read Acts 2:14-21. How does Peter use Joel's prophecy (found in Joel 2:28-32) to explain what was happening?
2. Previously, in the Old Testament, God had acted by his Spirit through one or two key people at a time. How is this action of God's Spirit new?
3. What should be the significance of this widespread action of the Spirit for how our church or fellowship carries out its work?
4. Read Acts 2:22-41. Peter quotes Psalm 16 in Acts 2:25-28, saying it is a prophecy about Jesus. Even though David wrote the psalm, what evidence does Peter give that David can't possibly be talking about himself here?
5. Why does Peter say the psalm must be talking about Jesus instead?
6. Peter then quotes Psalm 110 in Acts 2:34-35. How does this add to his argument that Jesus is Israel's true Lord?
7. How do Peter's hearers respond to his words that they had crucified the one God made Lord and Christ?

Take Home

1. Why is repentance inseparable from true saving faith?
2. What does it mean to accept Jesus as Saviour and Lord? Can a person accept Jesus as Savior without accepting Him as Lord?
3. Read Acts 2:42-47 for next week.

- Pray specifically this week for at least one person you know well who needs to hear and respond to the gospel.
- Pray for your church family and leaders
- Determine and do an act of kindness to demonstrate the love of Christ for someone this week who needs encouragement.
